## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Thanks go out to so many that were involved in the renovation of the Gazebo. The Men's Club spearheaded the project with Dave, Ricky, and Frank in the lead, and all of you volunteers who donated your time. It was nice to even see some of the women that helped (just making sure that their husbands knew how to paint and not ruin their clothes, that would make the wives more work doing the laundry). The Men's Club agreed to help with the project by donating some of the money they earned last year doing breakfasts, brunches, and dinners. In the last couple of years, they have bought a chain saw, weed whip, and numerous hand tools and toolboxes. Thank you to everyone for doing their part in washing and weeding around their units. For those who have not done theirs yet, or notified the office about doing so, they will be getting a friendly reminder before we turn it over to the Fining Board. It is The Board of Directors' obligation to follow and enforce the By-Laws and Rules and Regulations as we have been informing you at meetings and in newsletters. A lot of things have changed in the past two years at the Health Department. Two weeks ago, we had an unexpected and surprise visit from the Health Department. We were written up for three Code Violations: (1) not having daily test logs at the pool; (2) weeds behind one of the units in a flower bed that was over grown; and (3) a trash can behind one of the units without a lid. So, with The Board of Directors enforcing our By-Laws and Rules and Regulations, we will turn the violations over to the Fining Board and the fines will be real (\$100.00 a day up to a maximum of 10 days or \$1,000.00). I was in Ohio last week, and after receiving these violations Kathy called me and was quite upset. We just spent \$2,400.00 this summer so as not to have any problems with the pool. Kathy took care of this problem with an email and the other problems I took care of when I got back. We, The Board of Directors, are held accountable for what happens in the Park. So, please don't be upset with us when we are trying to do our job. Enjoy the rest of your winter!!!
